

DROWSY DRIVER AWARENESS

Driving while you are tired is a dangerous combination. Most people are aware of the dangers of drinking and driving, but do not realize that drowsy driving can be just as fatal. Like alcohol, sleepiness slows reaction time, decreases awareness, impairs judgment, and increases your risk of crashing.



DANGER SIGNS

- Heavy eyelids, frequent blinking, or difficulty focusing.
- Wandering, disconnected thoughts.
- Missing exits or traffic signs, cannot remember the last few miles driven.
- Rubbing your eyes or yawning.
- Trouble keeping your head up.
- Drifting from your lane, tailgating, or nearly crashing.
- Feeling restless and irritable.

MISSION AND PURPOSE

BWP Foundation was set up to keep our daughter's legacy alive, through mission aviation, prison ministry, grief counseling/ seminars, and drowsy driving awareness. How are we doing this? By bringing Hope to Hurting Hearts in Reconciliation, Redemption, and Restoration.



GRIEF MINISTRY

Hope for Hurting Hearts was designed to bring healing to those who experience loss—loss of a child, spouse, loved one through accident or incarceration, suicide, illness or any type of death which causes grief, pain and suffering. We have materials available we can send you to assist in the grieving process for yourself, or a loved one, or friend. Please contact us if necessary. We also provide one on one counseling and present at grief group seminars.



PRISON MINISTRY

We are amazed what God hath done in 2025 through BWP's prison ministry. We've seen a tremendous increase in demand this year. At present, we are sending out more than 70 books and Bibles weekly, a 75% increase over last year, into 48 prisons we are now servicing in the state of Arizona. We rejoice how it is setting the captives free in bringing hope to hurting hearts, shining great light into the darkness and depression of prison life. What a joy indeed!



Besides the hundreds of thank you letters and notes we've received from inmates; we had a real highlight over the summer months. One of the faithful Christian brothers in the facilities we service, who has artistic drawing talent, created several beautiful animal pictures tailored with the personal names of the children in our church. These children take up a weekly offering for BWP's prison ministry, and have raised \$8,200, first ten months of the year. We are so thankful for the commitment and support of our Church family. It's made a tremendous difference. If our sister churches only took the commission of Matthew 25:36 seriously, how many more souls could be reached.

BWP's workload has increased with re-entry needs, such as: clothes, food, transportation, and housing, because many of these inmates lack outside support. Our goal is that every man and woman who re-enters society will not return to prison life. This is shown to them by us meeting their needs.

Here is a thank you response from an inmate:

I just want to reach out and thank you again for your ministry. You have brought me hope in a desperate time in my life. You guys are definitely a blessing to me, and I see your outreach all the time. My friend in here just got the Bible you sent him, that his aunt asked you to send him. God bless you guys.*

We ask that you partner with us in one of three ways: 1) a one-time donation 2) a monthly donation or 3) "adopt" an inmate for \$30 monthly to cover their hygiene needs. We are in desperate need of literature for English and Spanish. Please keep this ministry in your prayers. Thank you.
